## **Covia Mine Advisory Committee Update**



Residents and Covia members of the Covia Mine Advisory Committee (CMAC), formerly known as Public Liaison Committee (PLC), met on October 22. There were no operational changes to report at the mine sites. No environmental complaints were received by Covia over the spring to fall period. The required testing for dust, noise and vibration under their Environment Certificate of Approval continues to be scheduled for 2025. The CMAC is working on filling one vacancy on the Committee by the end of the year, and taking this opportunity to update their existing Terms of Reference to clarify on how this process will work going forward.

## **Aquatic Research Partner Workshop**

You're invited to register for this workshop at no cost on December 9th from 8:45 am to 4:30 pm. It's a hybrid format so you can attend via ZOOM. More details will follow for those who REGISTER for the ZOOM link: https://forms.gle/arBa69yBWZRxHwVL6

Lake association members, resource managers, anglers, and anyone interested in the lakes and rivers of south-central and eastern ON including the Trent-Severn and Rideau Waterways are welcome to attend. There will be presentations by students and professors from Carleton U, Ontario Tech U, U Ottawa, Toronto Metropolitan U, Queen's U, Trent U, and U Illinois. Topics will include recreational fisheries science; aquatic weed control methods; shoreline protection; water quality; and invasive species. There will be an opportunity for questions & discussion to help guide future research.

### **Winter Lake Lights**

You are again reminded to turn off ALL lights (including outdoor solar lights) that are not absolutely necessary over the winter. The less light, the better for nature. Studies show that lights do not keep your property safe (just the opposite). Let's all do our part to keep the beautiful, dark night skies at Kosh.



#### Wildlife Wonders - Acorns

Have you ever walked barefoot in the early fall and found yourself doing the acorn hop? Those pointy ends are sharp! While acorns are obviously not wildlife, their autumn abundance is critical to many species. This nut (or seed) of an oak tree is full of nutrients. 25% of a deer's fall diet is acorns! Squirrels, chipmunks, rabbits, woodpeckers, blue jays, turkeys, crows, quail, raccoons, and even wood ducks and moose all eat them. But an acorn's job is to grow more oak trees, not feed animals. So to deter eaters, an acorn contains tannin, a bitter chemical that can be toxic. But as often happens in nature, many animals have devised workarounds. Some choose acorn species that contain fewer tannins. Others "cure" them by burying them until groundwater has leached out the tannins. Certain animals have special digestive systems that destroy the tannins. And some, like deer, eat so many that the acorns quickly pass through them and they don't absorb all the chemicals. But just often enough, an animal forgets where it buried one and a new oak tree can start growing.
